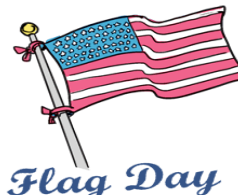

### Town Trivia for the month of June

**1910**—The Independent Order of Odd Fellows (I.O.O.F.) of Point Marion, Lodge No. 1173 received its Charter from the Grand Lodge of Pennsylvania.

**1929**—West Penn Power Co. has a booth at the 12<sup>th</sup> annual Chemical Industries Exposition in New York.

**1935**—State Liquor Control Board at Harrisburg announced that a liquor store would be opened in this community.

**1939**—A garden tea party was held at Friendship Hill for the sesquicentennial anniversary celebration to commemorate the erection of the building.

**1940**—The West Penn Power Dam at Lake Lynn is ordered to erect a heavy fence on the grounds surrounding the mammoth plant. This is to guard the Nation's electric power system against any hostile acts.

**1944**—A break in the Standard Oil Company crude oil line near the Greer Mansion on Lake Lynn poured over 200,000 barrels of oil into the lake.

\*150 Tri-Hi-Y girls will arrive at Camp Buddy this week. It is operated by the Pittsburgh YMCA.

\*Ration books still being used. The correct color and number will enable a consumer to purchase a quota for meats, fats, processed foods, etc.

\*Volunteers are needed to help in the Fifth War Loan Drive. A poster shows a soldier with a bullet hole in his helmet saying,

“I died today. What did you do?”

**1948**—A new \$85,000 drive-in theater to open on Route 119 near the York Run Crossroads.

**1950**—The Monongahela River leads the nation's waterways in the volume of bituminous coal and lignite transported by barge.

**1952**—The great-grandson and namesake of Albert Gallatin dies in New York City at age 71.

**1966**—The three remaining brick streets in Point Marion will soon be repaved.

**1970**—Cub Scout Pack 662 appeared on The Paul Shannon Show on Channel 4 in Pittsburgh.

**1975**—A group appears before city council to protest the proposed ordinance prohibiting farm animals with the Borough.

**1992**—The largest garage sale in the community will be held for the benefit of the old Mount Moriah Cemetery.

**1996**—The 911 system is on line in the Borough.

\*Point Marion Progress Club celebrates their 75<sup>th</sup> anniversary with a luncheon. The club began in May 1920.
